A Quick Guide to Protecting Your Computers Over the Holidays

1. Back Up Your Data

2. Update and Relax

Updates, may not be the most exciting thing, but they're important. Install any waiting updates, especially for antivirus software, before powering down. A secure computer is a happy computer.

3. Turn Off and Unplug Everything

Switch off all computers, printers, and other equipment. If possible, unplug them to protect against power surges, which are more common in colder weather.

4. Prepare for the Chill

If your office isn't going to be heated, low temperatures could affect your equipment.

- Cover your computers with breathable fabric to keep out dust and moisture.
- Pop a few silica gel packs nearby—they're great for absorbing dampness.
- When you're back, let your devices warm to room temperature before turning them on. This prevents condensation from causing damage.
